CERN Internship

Seven students of XI and XII along with Ms. Paramjeet Kaur, visited the global hub of Particle Physics, birthplace of the Higgs Boson, CERN, in Geneva, Switzerland from June 18–24, 2017. Under the lead of eminent scientist Kenneth Mick Storr, they attended various workshops, lectures and interactive sessions by many great particle physicists and visited various facilities around CERN learning about their 27 km long LHC tube, the ATLAS and CMS detectors.

Internship at Moolchand and Fortis Hospital

An internship programme was conducted at Moolchand Hospital. Around 25 students of class XII had the opportunity to interact with well-known clinical psychologists and psychiatrists.

The Fortis group held an intensive 6-day-internship for thirty students of class XI at Fortis La Femme, Greater Kailash and Fortis Vasant Kunj. It was headed by Dr. Heba, a psychooncologist and Ms. Tanya, a clinical psychologist. The techniques of psychological interview, sports psychology, art therapy and many more topics were covered, deeming these sessions fruitful.

STEM Lab

Aiming towards enriching the knowledge of the students in four subjects — Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, the school introduced the STEM robotics lab.

Psychology Workshop

The school conducted a workshop for the LGBT binaries for class XII. LGBT binary is the classification as sex and gender into two distinct, opposite and disconnected forms of masculine and feminine. This workshop was conducted by Mrs. Shreeja (Consultant at Max Healthcare).
