

Examination & Assessment Rules

Examinations are no less important than teaching. Our tests / examinations are devised to develop the habit of regular, systematic and methodical work among the students.

For Class X & XII

Examinations of this class are held in two categories i.e. Unit Tests and Terminal Exams. Course content for the Terminal Exams shall be the entire course covered upto that term while for the Unit Tests it shall be the course covered during the period of that cycle. In each academic year, the school shall hold the following Tests and Examinations:-

1.	Two Unit Test cycles	April & July
2.	First Term Examination	August
3.	Pre Board I Examination	November
4.	Pre Board II Examination	December

For Class XI

The final assessment / result of the student for promotion to the next class shall be compiled from the Annual record of the student calculated on the basis of weightage shown here under:-

1.	Unit Tests I	10%
2.	Unit Tests II	10%
3.	TERM-I	30%
4.	TERM-II	50%

A student must obtain at least 40% marks in each of the subjects taught to pass the examination.

For Class I to V

Assessment is based on written as well as oral tests. Evaluation will be based on the day to day work, and conduct of the students would be subjected to three assessments distributed periodically. Students would be subjected to three assessments distributed periodically. It would also include projects/ activities / quizzes / assignments / classwork / homework. The student will be marked / graded according to his / her performance in these assessments.

For Pre School & Pre Primary

Children are assessed on their day to day work and conduct throughout the year.
